



Streams and lakes and creeks and ponds are bodies of water called aquatic habitats. Fish, like **trout**, live in these habitats where they find food, shelter, space, and even oxygen. Most trout prefer plankton and aquatic insects as their main food sources, but others prefer to feed on smaller fish. Trout are either spring spawners or fall spawners, which means they deposit their eggs in the water.
