#### INTRODUCTION

The Wyoming Bird Checklist is part of the Wyoming Game and Fish Department's Nongame Program and is designed to enhance the user's opportunity to view and understand Wyoming's wildlife and wildlands.

This checklist contains 444 species that have been known to occur in the state of Wyoming. Its purpose is to help the user become more aware of birds occurring in the state and provide an organized method for recording observations.

Common bird names are used and are listed in American Ornithologists' Union (AOU) format. Because names are constantly being changed, this checklist may not match your field guide or other checklists. Distribution information for six regions of Wyoming is provided, with a (+) designating regions where a species may be found. Seasonal status, abundance, and general habitat preferences are also listed, with corresponding keys located at the beginning of the checklist. Space is provided on the right hand side of the checklist to record the date and location of your observations, and additional space for notes and drawings is included in the back of the checklist.

Birds with a seasonal status of "R" (year-round resident) or "S" (summer resident) can be assumed to breed in at least part of Wyoming, although this may not always be the case. Birds with a seasonal status of "M" (migrant), "W" (winter resident), or "A" (accidental) generally do not breed in Wyoming.

Successful use of this checklist will require using a field guide containing color photographs or illustrations. A list of several field guides is located at the end of this introduction. Binoculars or a spotting scope are essential, and you may want to carry a camera, as well.

Bird watching can be done in conjunction with other activities or by planning special outings. Field trips should be scheduled for early morning or evening hours when birds are most active. Moving slowly and quietly and staying concealed can greatly improve your opportunities to view birds.

Most people can watch birds at their homes. Landscaping, especially with native plants, and providing a bird feeder and water will create viewing opportunities at your window. (Information on attracting wildlife to your yard is available at your local Wyoming Game and Fish Department office.) Wyoming Game and Fish Department management areas, national forests and other public lands, rural areas, and local parks are convenient areas for short trips. Areas that contain riparian habitat usually support a wider variety of birds. Wildlife refuges and national parks are excellent places for bird observation. These areas may provide tours, lectures, and other information on local wildlife.

Membership in the Audubon Society or a local birding club is a great way to learn and meet people with the same interests. These organizations conduct meetings, lectures, and field trips, and may publish newsletters or journals. Some organizations you may be interested in joining are listed on the following page.



NW = northwest (includes latilongs 1, 2, 8, and 9).

NC = northcentral (includes latilongs 3, 4, 5, 10, 11, and 12).

NE = northeast (includes latilongs 6, 7, 13, and 14).

SW = southwest (includes latilongs 15, 16, 22, and 23).

SC = southcentral (includes latilongs 17, 18, 19, 24, 25, and 26).

SE = southeast (includes latilongs 20, 21, 27, and 28).

#### LEGEND FOR CHECKLIST

#### **SEASONAL STATUS**

- R = Species that inhabits Wyoming year-round.
- S = Species that inhabits Wyoming during the summer breeding season (June-August; especially July) and migrates out of the state during the non-breeding season.
- W = Species that inhabits Wyoming during the winter (especially January), but is absent during the summer.
- M = Species is found in Wyoming only during spring and/or autumn migration (records are especially lacking for July and January).
- A = Species with accidental, unpredictable occurrence of individuals because its range does not include Wyoming.
- U = Species that occurs in Wyoming but seasonal status is uncertain.

#### **ABUNDANCE**

- 1 = Rare (species occupies only a small percentage of the preferred habitat within its range or is found throughout its range in extremely low densities).
- 2 = Uncommon (species is common only in limited areas within its range or is found throughout its range in relatively low densities).
- 3 = Common (species inhabits much of the preferred habitat within its range).
- 4 = Abundant (species inhabits most of the preferred habitat within its range).
- 5 = Unknown (species whose existence within Wyoming is verified but insufficient information is available to determine abundance).
- 6 = Controlled (species currently exists in Wyoming only with human assistance).

#### **HABITAT TYPES**

- FO = Coniferous and Deciduous Forest found in combination or single species stands. Conifers include pine, fir, and spruce; deciduous species include aspen.
- SH = Shrubland areas dominated by one or more of the following: sagebrush, bitterbrush, mountain mahogany, chokecherry, serviceberry, greasewood, and/or juniper.
- RI = Riparian areas bordering streams, lakes, and rivers. Characteristic vegetation includes cottonwood, willow, spruce/fir, and tall grasses.
- PR = Prairie open expanses of grasslands east of the Rocky Mountains dominated by blue grama, buffalo grass, wheatgrass, bluestem, and silver sagebrush.
- ME = Meadows includes wet-moist meadows and wet-moist meadow grasslands.
- WL = Wetlands areas where water is present most of the time. Includes marshes, lakes, and rivers. Vegetation includes cattails, rushes, sedges, and willows.
- AG = Agricultural Croplands areas that are used intensively to produce grain, forage, livestock, etc. Includes pasture, croplands, and irrigated native meadows. May include shelterbelts.
- SF = Special Features areas having unique characteristics such as cliffs, ledges, rock outcrops, caves, canyons, shorelines, waterfalls, burns, logging, buildings, mines, roadsides, etc.
- UR = Urban and built up areas, garbage dumps, highway bridges, abandoned buildings, and occupied buildings.
- ALL = All habitat types.
