# STOP AQUATIC HITCHHIKERS

*You can stop the spread of invasive species. Before and after working in or around water, follow these simple steps:*

- ✓ **DRAIN** Drain all water from your tanks and equipment. Leave wet compartments open to dry.
- ✓ **CLEAN** Clean all plants, mud, and debris from vehicle, tanks, and equipment.
- ✓ **DRY** Dry vehicle, tanks, and equipment thoroughly.

- Avoid transferring water between drainages or between unconnected waters within the same drainage.
- Conduct work from upstream to downstream in a water or drainage.
- Avoid sucking organic and bottom material into water intakes.
- Avoid obtaining water from multiple sources. Use potable water when possible.

*Contact the Wyoming Game and Fish Department if you see any invasive species on your equipment, or to schedule an inspection.*
