

Medicine Butte 2020

The **Medicine Butte Hunter Management Area** is open to hunt rabbits, antelope, deer, elk, moose, and mountain lion during the specific species seasons as published in the current Wyoming Game & Fish Commission Regulations and with the following limitations:

- **Each hunter** must have a **permission slip** and a **vehicle pass** to the specific hunter management area and species they are hunting. **Anyone without Department permission shall be subject to trespass charges.**
 - Non-hunting/non-permitted persons may assist in game retrieval on the hunter management area as long as they are accompanying a permitted hunter and do not possess a firearm.
- **Deer hunting** access (Hunt Area 168):
 - **Archery Season:**
 - Unlimited permission slips available for September 1 – 30.
 - **Firearms Season:**
 - One hundred-fifty (150) total permission slips issued through a **random drawing**.
 - Seventy-five (75) permission slips issued for October 1 – 4, and,
 - Seventy-five (75) permission slips issued for the period October 7 – 11.
- **Other listed species hunting** access:
 - Unlimited number of permission slips available for August 15 - October 31.
- **Persons may not scout or trespass** before or after their designated access period!
- **Motorized travel** is allowed on **established roads only**.
 - Established roads are “any road or trail graded or constructed to carry motorized vehicular traffic or on which repeated motorized vehicle traffic has created well-defined tracks”.
 - Abide by all signs and posted areas.
- **Possession or use of Off Road Vehicles or commonly called “ORVs, ATV’s, UTV’s, side by sides, four wheeler, dirt bike, etc”, as defined by Wyoming Statute 31-1-101, is prohibited.**
- Leave all gates closed. Keep off oil and gas sites. Respect ranch property by not littering.
- Do not damage fences, range improvements, or harass livestock. Livestock has right of way.
- Do not shoot in the direction of livestock, buildings, roads, oil and gas sites, or any object other than the animal you are hunting.
- No camping or campfires on private or state trust land.
- **Report any wildlife violation by calling 1-877-WGFD-TIP (1-877-943-3847).** Future hunting opportunities depend on hunter compliance with all ranch rules.
- **If you harvest an animal on private land, turn in or mail the landowner coupon to the appropriate landowner where the animal was harvested:**
