

# Walk-In Area Rules

- ✓ WIA Rules and regulations only apply to private lands enrolled in the PLPW Access Program. Anglers should review Public Use Rules for State Lands prior to fishing.
- ✓ Walk-in Areas are private property and only landowners may allow other activities, such as trapping, antler hunting, photography, hiking, bird watching, etc.
- ✓ Access is limited to individual access for fishing and does not include access for any commercial activity, including outfitting. These areas are for fishing only.
- ✓ Walk-In Areas are for foot travel only! Any travel exceptions are listed in the footnotes of the fishing area maps.
- ✓ Consult current Game & Fish Commission Fishing Regulations for specific fishing season and creel limit restrictions.
- ✓ Fishing is restricted to the boundaries of the Walk-in Area and is not permitted on adjoining private land.
- ✓ Some fishing Walk-in Areas are also enrolled in hunting. If posted signs indicate hunting and fishing, see
- ✓ current WIA Hunting Atlas for dates the area is open for hunting and species allowed.
- ✓ Anglers must be ethical, sportsmanlike, courteous and safe.
- ✓ Be aware of fire hazards.
- ✓ Do not litter. Pack out all trash (including wrappers, cigarette butts, and cans).
- ✓ **NO CAMPING OR FIRES ON ACCESS AREAS.**
- ✓ Report all violations to 1-877-WGFD-TIP.

Walk in Fishing Access areas are funded by you, the angler. If you use any of the Walk in Fishing areas or know someone who does, help us keep these areas open each year. You can do this by respecting the landowner, following the Walk- in Rules and by donating to this valuable program.

Remember to donate to Access Yes when purchasing your licenses.

## Directions to use the Atlas

This Walk-in Area atlas is organized by major river drainages. A red dot and a specific number indicate the Walk-in Areas in each drainage. Detailed descriptions of the numbered Walk-in Areas are illustrated on the following pages. Walk-in Area boundaries are marked in red. \*An **established road** is defined as “any road or trail on the Department’s Private Lands Public Wildlife Walk-in Access Program or Hunter Management Program which has been graded or constructed to carry motorized vehicular traffic or on which repeated motorized vehicular traffic has created well-defined tracks”.

\*A **designated road** is defined as “only established roads on the Department’s Private Lands Public Wildlife Walk-in Access Program or Hunter Management Program **marked by a Department sign as open to motorized vehicular traffic**”. Anglers may use these roads on a Walk-in Area only if it is explicitly stated so on the Walk-in Area signs.

**The sole purpose of the maps illustrated in this publication is to identify Walk-in Areas.** These maps are not designed to provide accurate information on public and private land status. Land status is in a perpetual state of flux given exchange and/or sale of public and private lands. As a result, current status of land parcels marked as state, BLM or USFS may be different than that represented in the base map. Please refer to the respective land management agencies for the current status of the land administered by them. Do not use the information provided in this publication for any other purpose than to identify Walk-in Areas.
