



Unusual call

Greybull Game Warden Bill Robertson responded to a report of an osprey hanging from a nest east of Basin last month. With the assistance of Basin’s town linemen, the osprey was cut loose from the fishing line it was tangled up in. The “fire wire” fishing line that is commonly used in cat fishing is nearly impossible to break. The young bird was taken to Ironside Bird Rescue and is being treated for wounds to its leg but it is expected to survive and be released.


