

RESIDENT PERMANENTLY AND TOTALLY DISABLED LIFETIME FISHING LICENSE AND CONSERVATION STAMP

STATUTORY AUTHORITY:

W.S. 23-1-302 (q) The commission shall, by rule and regulation, establish a process for issuing a resident lifetime fishing license and conservation stamp at no cost to any resident who is permanently and totally disabled. As used in this subsection, "permanently and totally disabled" means the presence of a permanent physical or mental condition that prevents a person from engaging in substantial gainful activity.

QUALIFICATION FOR LICENSE:

To be eligible for a Permanently and Totally Disabled Lifetime Fishing License and Conservation Stamp you must be a resident who has continuously resided in Wyoming for at least 1 year immediately preceding the date of application. W.S. 23-2-101(a)

An Official Social Security Administration Disability Benefits Verification Letter (official Social Security Administration logo must be present in the document's letterhead) determining the applicants eligibility of Supplemental Security Income or Social Security Disability Insurance benefits must be attached to the application to be considered complete.

RESIDENT LICENSE FEE:

No Charge.

LICENSE EXPIRATION:

The license is valid for the life of the license holder.

LICENSE ISSUANCE:

Licenses are issued only at headquarters in Cheyenne or at Wyoming Game and Fish Department Regional Offices located in JACKSON, PINEDALE, CODY, SHERIDAN, GREEN RIVER, LARAMIE, LANDER, or CASPER.

In addition, applications can be mailed to any of the regional offices or the headquarters office.

Allow 15 business days from the day you mail your request for processing and receipt of your license.
