WYOMING OUTDOOR HALL OF FAME PROCESS FOR SELECTION STANDARDS FOR INDUCTION NOMINATION FORM

Inductee Nominations

Any organization or individual can nominate an individual for induction into the Wyoming Outdoor Hall of Fame. Nominations will be accepted through March 31, 2026. The Hall of Fame induction ceremony will take place in November 2026.

Inductee Selection

The Director of the Wyoming Game and Fish Department or his/her designee shall be the Chair of the Selection Committee. The Committee shall be comprised of five individuals selected by the Committee Chair and who shall serve at the pleasure of the Chair. The Committee shall be comprised of individuals who have exhibited a long-term commitment to conservation in the State of Wyoming. Selection of inductees shall be by majority vote of the Committee. The Committee may annually select up to four inductees from the nominee pool. The Committee will review all nominations and determine the inductees each year; the Committee's decisions will be final.

Standards for Induction

The following represents standards for induction into the Wyoming Outdoor Hall of Fame. The Selection Committee shall use these standards as a written guide in making inductee selections, but shall not be limited to only these standards:

- Whether the nominee's contribution was of such a nature as to have statewide, inter-state or national significance;
- Whether the nominee's contribution affected a wide range of natural resources and their use;
- Whether the nominee's contributions were made in a manner that will enable them to be measured in context of past inductee or nominee contributions, and in the historical setting of the time in which he or she lived, or lives;
- The nominee must have influenced conservation in Wyoming through a sustained and outstanding contribution during the course of their employment, or through volunteer efforts, in at least one - and preferably several - of the following areas:
 - Environmental law enforcement
 - Applied resource management
 - Conservation education
 - Conservation policy formation, legislation, and public leadership
 - Conservation-oriented research
 - Conservation literature and art or journalism
 - Volunteer or paid efforts in the interest of conservation
- If the nominee is a living person, to be considered they shall be at a stage in their career that their contributions to conservation are undeniable, and their contributions are likely not to be impugned by any of their present or future endeavors.
