

Deep Creek HMA 2016

- **The Deep Creek Hunter Management Area is open August 15 – December 15, 2016 to hunt antelope, deer, and elk** during specific species seasons as published in the 2016 Game & Fish Commission Regulations.
- **Each hunter must have a permission slip and a displayed vehicle pass** to the specific hunter management area and the species they are hunting. **Anyone without Department permission shall be subject to trespass charges.** Vehicle pass should be displayed in window while on the Hunter Management Area.
- Access is limited to individual access for hunting of the species listed on the permission slip. Hunting of **ANY OTHER SPECIES** requires written permission from the landowner.
- **Preseason scouting is not permitted.** Access is restricted to the specific season dates and the restrictions on the permission slip.
- **Hunt on foot or horseback only.** Vehicle parking is permitted at the designated parking area as indicated on the accompanying map.
- **No ORV's permitted.**
- Non-hunting/non-permitted persons may assist in game retrieval on the HMA as long as they are accompanying a permitted hunter and do not possess a firearm.
- Abide by all signs and posted areas. Some pastures or areas may be posted closed to hunting for certain periods of time because of livestock presence.
- **No fishing.**
- **No camping and no campfires.** Hunters are reminded that camping is not allowed on state trust lands.
- Do not shoot in the direction of, or within 100 yards of, livestock or buildings. Do not damage range improvements or harass livestock.
- Leave gates as you find them.
- Access is limited to individual access for hunting the species listed on the permission slip. Hunting of ANY OTHER SPECIES requires written permission from the landowner.
- Access is limited to individual access for hunting and does not include access for any commercial activity, including outfitting and guiding of hunters. Hunter Management Areas are private property and only landowners may allow other activities, such as trapping, antler hunting, photography, hiking, etc.
- **BLOOD SAMPLES. Hunters are reminded the Department is conducting brucellosis testing on elk. Hunters need to collect a blood sample and submit it for testing.**
- Report any wildlife violation by calling 1-877-WGFD-TIP (877-943-3847).
- Future hunting opportunities depend on hunter compliance with all ranch rules. Any violation will result in immediate loss of access privileges.
