

Heart Mountain HMA 2016

- **Heart Mountain Hunter Management Area is open November 1 – December 21, 2016 to hunt elk** during specific species seasons as published in the 2016 Game and Fish Commission Regulations. **Also note the following exceptions:**
 - **BULL ELK HUNTING – 15 permission slips will be available on a first come first serve basis for hunting elk with an Area 54 Type 1 license. Access is permitted November 1 - November 30 ONLY.**
 - **ANTLERLESS ELK HUNTING**
 - **Unlimited permission slips available for antlerless elk hunting permitted November 1 – December 21 ONLY. No access permitted prior to November 1.**
- **Each hunter must have a permission slip** and a **displayed vehicle pass** to the hunter management area and the specific animal they are hunting. **Anyone without Department permission shall be subject to trespass charges.** Vehicle pass should be displayed in window while on the Hunter Management Area.
- Access is limited to individual access for hunting of the species listed on the permission slip. **Hunting of ANY OTHER SPECIES requires written permission from the landowner.**
- **Preseason scouting is not permitted.** Access is restricted to the dates listed above.
- **Hunt on foot or horseback only.** Vehicle access is allowed only on **DESIGNATED** roads to the parking areas as indicated on the accompanying map. All other roads are closed. Designated roads will be marked with a white arrow. No off-road travel is permitted.
- Do not shoot in the direction of, or within 100 yards of, livestock or buildings. Do not damage range improvements or harass livestock. Leave gates as you find them. Use only certified weed-free hay for your horses while on the Hunter Management Area.
- **No camping and no campfires.** Hunters are reminded that camping is not permitted on state trust lands.
- **Lead free ammunition required for all hunting. Use of suppressors on firearms is not permitted on The Nature Conservancy property.**
- Non-hunting/non-permitted persons may assist in game retrieval on the HMA as long as they are accompanying a permitted hunter and do not possess a firearm.
- Abide by all signs and posted areas.
- Access is limited to individual access for hunting and does not include access for any commercial activity, including outfitting and guiding of hunters. Hunter Management Areas are private property and only landowners may allow other activities, such as trapping, antler hunting, photography, hiking, etc.
- **BLOOD SAMPLES. Hunters are reminded the Department is conducting brucellosis testing on elk. Hunters need to collect a blood sample and submit it for testing.**
- Report any wildlife violation 1-877-WGFD-TIP (877-943-3847).
- Future hunting opportunities depend on hunter compliance with all ranch rules. Any violation will result in immediate loss of access privileges.
