

Iron Mountain Hunter Management and Access Program Ranch Rules 2013

The Hunter Management and Access Program (HMAP) is an excellent opportunity for hunters to access private lands to harvest cow/calf elk. The opportunity to hunt on these private lands is a privilege. The success of this program and future hunting opportunities on these lands depends on your compliance with all ranch rules as well as Wyoming Game and Fish Commission regulations.

- **Hunters must attend a mandatory orientation the morning of the first day of their hunt period, located at the Laramie Regional Game and Fish office at 6:00 am, or at the Cheyenne Headquarters building at 5:30 am.**
- **Hunters may choose to check in at the Laramie Regional office OR the Cheyenne Headquarters building. (See map for directions)**
- The HMAP is open to **antlerless elk hunting ONLY with valid elk area 5 type 6, area 6 types 1, 4, and 6 or general licenses.**
- You are only granted access to hunt on the specific 2-day hunt period your permit is valid.
- Hunters should not contact any participating landowners.
- Persons may not hunt any other species.
- Persons may not scout or trespass prior to their designated access period.
- No motorcycles or ATVs allowed.
- Non-hunting/non-permitted persons may assist in game retrieval as long as they are accompanying a permitted hunter and do not possess a firearm.
- Access is not granted for commercial activity including outfitting of hunters.
- Ethical hunting practices are expected at all times. These include respecting the landowners and their land, fellow hunters, livestock, wildlife, and being aware of your surroundings to ensure a safe and enjoyable experience.

Additional ranch rules and area maps will be available only at orientation meetings in Cheyenne and Laramie.
