

TURTLE HILL HUNTER MANAGEMENT AREA (HMA)

Open August 15 -October 31, 2024 for the taking of **antelope** during specific seasons as published in the 2024 Game and Fish Commission Regulations

GENERAL RULES:

- Each hunter must possess a valid permission slip while in the field
- Each hunter must display a valid vehicle pass in the window
- Foot access only is allowed
- Leave gates as you find them
- Non-hunting, non-permitted persons may accompany a permitted hunter with a valid permission slip
- GPS/Mapping Service highly recommended in accessing this property
- Access only during dates specified on permission slip for current year

RESTRICTIONS

- No taking of ANY OTHER SPECIES (except predators) or any other activities without landowner permission
- Driving on closed roads or behind closed area gates or signs is not allowed
- Any commercial activity, including outfitting or guiding is not allowed
- Do not shoot in pivots with livestock present or near buildings
- Do not damage range improvements or harass livestock
- Camping within boundaries of HMA is not allowed
- No travel through HMA to take wildlife not listed on permission slip

Turtle Hill HMA specific rules:

- **You may drive on ESTABLISHED roads for game retrieval only within HMA boundaries.**
- The gate for game retrieval access within the HMA is located on the map indicated by the “P” parking symbol on the west boundary of the property. Please close the gate behind you.
- Doe/fawn only antelope may be harvested from August 15 - September 30 with proper license.
- Any antelope may be harvested from October 1 –31, 2023 with proper valid license.

TURTLE HILL HUNTER MANAGEMENT AREA (HMA)

Open August 15 - October 31, 2024 for the taking of **antelope** during specific seasons as published in the 2024 Game and Fish Commission Regulations

DEFINITIONS:

- Take: means hunt, pursue, catch, capture, shoot, fish, seine, trap, kill, or possess, or attempt to hunt, pursue, catch, capture, shoot, fish, seine, trap, kill or possess.
- Established road: means any road or trail that has been graded or constructed to carry motor vehicles or on which repeated motor vehicle traffic has created well defined tracks.
- Designated road: means only established roads that are marked with a white arrow sign as open to motor vehicles. Roads not marked with a white arrow sign are **closed** to motor ve-
