# LA BARGE CREEK HUNTER MANAGEMENT AREA (HMA)

Open <u>August 15, 2025—October 12, 2025</u> for the taking of MOOSE during specific seasons as published in the current Game and Fish Commission Regulations

#### **GENERAL RULES:**

- Each hunter must possess a valid permission slip while in the field
- Each hunter must display a valid vehicle pass in the window
- Observe all Road Closed signs
- Foot or horseback access is allowed
- Leave gates as you find them
- Non-hunting, non-permitted persons may accompany a permitted hunter with a valid permission slip
- GPS/Mapping Service is highly recommended to access this property
- Access only allowed during dates specified on permission slip for current year

### **RESTRICTIONS**

- No take of ANY OTHER SPECIES or any other activities without written permission from the landowner
- Driving on closed roads or behind closed area gates or signs is not allowed
- Blinds or tree stands are not allowed. Temporary portable blinds may be used, but must be removed each night
- Any commercial activity, including outfitting or guiding is not allowed
- Do not shoot in the direction of, or within 100 yards of, livestock or buildings
- Do not damage range improvements or harass livestock
- Camping on the HMA is not allowed
- No travel through HMA to take wildlife not listed on permission slip
- No early admittance or scouting of the area. You have access to the hunter management area only during your specified time period.

## La Barge Creek HMA specific rules:

- Do not travel on roads when they are excessively wet or muddy.
- Please park in designated parking areas. (See Map)
- Established roads may be used for game retrieval only.
- Please do not use ranch driveways to access the HMA.

## **DEFINITIONS:**

- <u>Take:</u> means hunt, pursue, catch, capture, shoot, fish, seine, trap, kill, or possess, or attempt to hunt, pursue, catch, capture, shoot, fish, seine, trap, kill or possess.
- Established road: means any road or trail that has been graded or constructed to carry motor vehicles or on which repeated motor vehicle traffic has created well defined tracks.
