


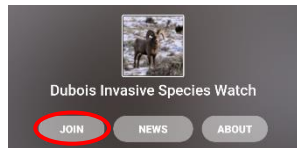


Dubois Invasive Species Watch

Dubois Invasive Species Watch is a **Citizen Science Project** to help land managers identify the extent of invasive species in the area surrounding Whiskey Basin Wildlife Habitat Management Area. **Bighorn sheep** are a community-wide iconic wildlife species that depends heavily on intact winter range and migration corridors. Rapidly responding to invasive species infestations will help **maintain habitat** for this and other wildlife species in the area.

- 2 Click [Log In or Sign Up](#)
- 3 **Join** our project!
 - Search for Dubois Invasive Species Watch under the projects tab.
 - Click join and start observing!



Make an Observation

- 4 Click [Upload](#)
- 5 Take a photo or choose one from a file.
- 6 Add the date of your observation.
- 7 Record the location. If your location is on, your phone will automatically locate where the photo was taken. Be sure this is as **precise as possible** so we can find it later!
- 8 **Add to our project.** Before you finish make sure you have selected our project to add your observation to.
 - Note the **patch size** of your observed species!
- 9 Submit your observation. You have just contributed to **citizen science!**
